February - THE UK/USA SPECIAL RELATIONSHIP: WHAT IS IT AND DO WE NEED IT?

Peter Burt from the Nuclear Information Service (NIS).

NIS is a small NGO which researches into the British nuclear weapons programme and challenges some of the myths surrounding the issue. Peter described the three pillars of the UK/USA 'special relationship' as he saw it: nuclear weapons, access to military bases and intelligence sharing.

March - CLIMATE CHANGE – IS IT A PEACE ISSUE?

Mark Levene, history lecturer, life-long peace campaigner, and co-founder of 'Crisis Forum'

'Crisis Forum' is a group of disgruntled academics who want to look beyond their own disciplines at the bigger picture and analyse crisis and conflict in a more holistic way, helping others to apply global knowledge to local contexts.

April - JESUS AND NON-VIOLENCE Rev. David Platt, a local Anglican minister and veteran peace campaigner with Christian CND

David spoke about Jesus' example of non-violent direct action and the parallels with today's peace activists and those like Desmond Tutu and Mo Mowlem who bring about forgiveness and reconciliation.

May - IRAN – FROM REVOLUTION TO RESISTANCE TO REVOLT

Alys Zaerin, a young Iranian living in London.

Alys had just returned from visiting family in Iran and spoke about the history of Western intervention in the country, recent uprisings and her faith in the young people of Iran to bring about reform.

June -'GLOBAL POWER: HAS THE DEATH OF BIN LADEN SHIFTED THE BALANCE?'

Kate Hudson, General Secretary. CND Although it would have been better to pursue Bin Laden after 9/11 rather than collectively punish Iraq and Afghanistan, Kate felt encouraged by the popular secular uprisings across the Middle East. She could not see an end to the 'War on Terror' and was watching with interest the emergence of China on the world stage.

FPG AND THE INTERVENTION IN LIBYA

At the February meeting we discussed the military intervention in Libya. Although sadly, as in all wars, innocent people were being killed, we agreed that a military solution was not the best one. Similarly to Iraq and Afghanistan, the motives are questionable and the exit strategy very unclear. Why Libya and not Bahrain for example? Was regime change the plan all along? The real evil behind it is the arms trade - it was pointed out that until a few months ago we were selling arms to Libya and continue to sell to other repressive regimes.
